- Clause I.153, FAR 52.204-11 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Reporting Requirements (MAR 2009) is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following FAR 52.204 – 11 – American Recovery and Reinvestment Act – Reporting Requirements (JUL 2010):
  - 1.153 52,204-11 AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT—REPORTING REQUIREMENTS (Jul 2010)
  - (a) Definitions. For definitions related to this clause (e.g., contract, first-tier subcontract, total compensation etc.) see the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) available at <a href="http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/recovery">http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/recovery</a> fags contractors. These FAQs are also linked under <a href="http://www.FederalReporting.gov">http://www.FederalReporting.gov</a>.
  - (b) This contract requires the contractor to provide products and/or services that are funded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act).   - (xi) Names and total compensation of each of the subcontractor's five most highly compensated officers, for the calendar year in which the subcontract is awarded if—
    - (A) In the subcontractor's preceding fiscal year, the subcontractor received—
      - 80 percent or more of its annual gross revenues in Federal contracts (and subcontracts), loans, grants (and subgrants), and cooperative agreements; and
      - (2) \$25,000,000 or more in annual gross revenues from Federal contracts (and subcontracts), loans, grants (and subgrants), and cooperative agreements; and
